Student and Parent Acknowledgement of Bully/Intimidation Policy

Bullying, intimidation, harassment and teen dating violence diminish a student's ability to learn and a school's ability to educate.

For purposes of this policy, the term bullying means any severe or pervasive physical or verbal act or conduct including written or electronic communication directed toward a student that has or can reasonably be predicted to have the effect of one or more of the following: placing the student in reasonable fear of harm to student's person or property, causing a substantially detrimental effect of the student's physical or mental health, substantially interfering with student's academic performance, substantially interfering with the student's ability to participate in or benefit from the services and activities provided by a school.

Bullying, intimidation, harassment and teen dating violence may take various forms, including without limitation: threats, stalking, physical violence, public humiliation (recording fights, sharing and posting fights and/or physical violence on social media, discussing a fight or possible fight), inciting a fight, inciting a mob, retaliation for asserting or alleging an act of bullying.

School authorities may require a student or his/her parent or guardian to provide a password or other related account information in order to gain access to the student's account or profile on social networking website if school authorities have reasonable cause to believe that a student's account on a social networking site contains evidence that a student has violated a school disciplinary school rule, policy or procedure.

Students may be subject to disciplinary consequences, up to and including suspension/expulsion from school for gross disobedience or misconduct which occurs on or within sight school grounds before, during or after school hours; at school sponsored or school related activities, in connection with student transportation, traveling to or from school or a school function, activity or event; at any place when the misconduct has a reasonable relationship to school or *may carry over into the school setting*.
